

Dambusters remembered 65 years on

A service and fly-past has been held to mark the 65th anniversary of the World War II Dambusters mission only a few miles from CDRs offices.

A Lancaster bomber flew three times over Derwent Reservoir in Derbyshire, which was used by the original pilots to train ahead of their famous raid. A Spitfire, a Hurricane, two Tornados and a Dakota transport plane joined the fly-past. CDR staff took a short break to view the events.
